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REMODELING CHECKLIST

When you are ready to remodel your home, make sure you keep this handy checklist close by!

Write It Down...walk through your home and write down all the dreams you have for it.





Plan It Out...figure out your financial resources so you know how much you can spend on a remodel project.



Call the Best...look to PRO of NE-IA for your best resource for professional, ethical and experienced remodeling companies, subcontractors and suppliers.



Do Your Homework...call the contractor's references, ask to go see at least one of their remodeling projects.



Give in to Your Gut...the remodeling contractor or subcontractor will "live" with you and your family for days or weeks or months. Your gut feeling tells you if you are comfortable with this person!



Define the Details...your remodeling proposal and/or contract should be comprehensive and include product descriptions, start and approximate completion dates, payment schedule, change order procedures, warranties, and alternative dispute resolution clauses.



Keep Your Perspective...remodeling can be disruptive to your normal household environment. Take a deep breath, keep your focus and work with the remodeling contractor or subcontractor for the end result.



Celebrate the Dream...invite your family, friends, neighbors to see your new remodeling project...and start dreaming about the next one!





Remodeling FAQ

How important is it for my remodeling contractor to be licensed and insured?

It's very important. Licensing and insurance are required in the City of Omaha and many surrounding areas. Ask for proof of licensing or call the issuing municipality to verify the license. For insurance, ask for a proof of insurance or call the insurance company with whom the contractor is insured to verify coverage.

There are so many from which to choose. How do I select my remodeling contractor?

It's best to employ a home improvement contractor with an established business in your area. Local firms can be checked through references from past customers in your community or through your local Better Business Bureau. Local remodelers are compelled to perform quality work that satisfies their customers for their business to survive. Many states, but not all, require contractors to be licensed and/or bonded. Contact your state or local licensing agencies to ensure the contractor meets all requirements. Ask the remodeling contractor for a current copy of their license. You can also check with the government Consumer Affairs Office and the Better Business Bureau to ensure there are no complaints on record for the contractor. Ask to see a copy of the remodeling contractor's certification of insurance for the name of his or her insurance agency to verify coverage. Most states require a contractor to carry worker's compensation, property damage and personal liability insurance. Make sure the contractor's insurance coverage meets all the minimum requirements.

How much should my remodeling project cost?

This really depends on the size and scope of your project. The materials chosen, the size of the room, and age of the infrastructure can all impact the project cost. Remember when you are comparing bids, that you are comparing the exact same scope from each contractor. If a price comes in that looks too good to be true, it probably is. How much value will my remodeling project add to my home? This also depends on the scope of your project, and you may be surprised which projects add the most value.

How long should my project take?

Again, this depends on the size and scope of your project, and what is found during demolition. Unforeseen problems can pop up once walls are taken down, and these new issues can require additional work. Ask your remodeling contractor for the most reasonable timeframe and stay in touch with him or her as the project progresses, so you can plan for a finish date.

Should I plan more money than the contract price?

Additional work or a change in the project requested by the remodeling homeowner usually require a contract price change. Planning for the unforeseen is wise, though, so putting aside an extra 10% over the contract price makes for a less stressful remodel.

How many estimates should I get for a remodeling project?

You can go about the process in different ways. Conventional wisdom dictates three estimates for any remodeling work you are going to have done. However, if a home improvement contractor comes highly recommended by a trusted source, and you have met and talked with the contractor and feel comfortable working with him or her, getting additional estimates may not be necessary.

I have three different estimates, and the prices vary greatly. Why?

There are a number of different factors that go into pricing a remodeling project. Be sure that every estimate has the same scope of work. If the estimates are vague and you cannot interpret that information, go back to the contractor for clarification in writing. If you are unable to get adequate written clarification, it may be wise to eliminate that remodeling contractor from the bidding process.

What can I expect to do while a remodeling project is being done in my home?

Most importantly, keep the lines of communication open between you and the remodeling contractor and the work crew. Ask questions. Let them know what your family schedule is and whether you have pets confined somewhere. It's important to keep the work areas off limits to children and pets for their safety; however, you may have a little extra dust and dirt in your house, so keeping the work area off limits will avoid them tracking the dust to other parts of the house.

THE CHALLENGE

The biggest challenge in the whole project was getting the powder bath entrance out of the kitchen area. We had to get real creative with the floor plan layout to ensure the most efficient and effective use of the space vs. their needs. With an unused dining room, need for a pantry, small and enclosed spaces, the want to open up and make useable space for a large family was at the forefront of the wish list.

THE VISION

Modern, clean, open feel with a textural neutral palette while being family friendly to 3 kids, 2 dogs, and a large island for entertaining was the ideal vision for this project.

THE SOLUTION

Flip walkways through doors, utilize the dining room that wasn't being used to enhance the usable kitchen area, and repurpose a closet and part of original powder to get more centralized access to the powder and a "galley" style kitchen was the perfect fit to integrate the wish list.

THE RESULTS

The client couldn't be happier! The spacious feeling with the clean lines makes this space feeling joyous to spend time with friends and family. Reimaging the floor plan with a walkin pantry of dreams became a reality giving this main level efficiency and a completely updated look.

METROPOLITAN



THE CHALLENGE

Walking into a dark and outdated space, the clients were ready for a change in their primary bathroom. As, with every space, there were challenges to overcome. Our main challenge was reworking the existing shower. The existing shower had an unflattering

angled glass that took away from the space. The homeowners wanted a more intentional layout. Finally, the oversized whirlpool tub, outdated flooring, and tile needed to be replaced to transform their primary bathroom into the bathroom of their dreams.

THE VISION

To make the homeowner's vision come to life, we wanted to find a way to brighten up the space while keeping the existing character. To do so, we needed to find a way to allow the natural light to shine through the front-facing windows while maintaining privacy. As for the shower, we used a large format white tile to give it more life. We knew that installing a wood-look tile on the bathroom floor, black penny tile on the shower floor, and a heavily grained wood vanity would generate the character the homeowner was looking for.

THE SOLUTION

We made the homeowner's vision come to life by first squaring off the shower which allowed us to put in a large bench and built-in niche. The next focus was the vanity, the homeowner wanted to add personality to the space by selecting dark-stained oak cabinetry. Our final solution was to frost the large windows above the tub to bring in more natural light to the space without losing privacy.

THE RESULTS

Left with an in-home oasis of their dreams - the clients are ready to enjoy their new spacious shower and soak in their new freestanding tub while admiring the beautiful dark-stained oak vanity. To make the shower shine, we used a large format white marble look tile on the walls, black penny tile for the shower floor, and honey bronze fixtures. The full overlay vanity was anchored by two utility cabinets with hamper pull outs in the bottom to allow for less clutter in the space. All the intentional details made this space feel like the inhome oasis the homeowners envisioned.

The Silverleaf Primary Bathroom





THE CHALLENGE

After purchasing a new home set in the rolling hills set off Blair High Road, the homeowners knew they wanted to rework the outdated kitchen and primary bath as soon as possible. The dark and cramped kitchen felt removed from the rest of the home. Therefore, opening that wall up was necessary but came with challenges.

The layout of the primary bathroom was not functional for the homeowner's needs - the space felt tight, and the design was outdated. Finding a way to make the bedroom, closet, and bathroom flow was our main challenge. With the home being a bit older, other unique challenges came along with these projects. But we were ready to get started and transform these spaces for the homeowners.

THE VISION

The homeowners had a vision in mind for each space. Starting in the kitchen, they wanted to open the space by removing the wall between the kitchen and living space, brighten up the space, implement a new cabinet layout with new full overlay painted maple shaker cabinets, a simple subway tile backsplash, new quartz countertops with veining for some movement, add a large island with seating, and re-stain the flooring.

Moving onto the primary bathroom, their main vision was to fix the awkward stairs that ruined the flow between the bedroom space and the bathroom. To make their vision come to life, we needed to find a way to move the stairs leading to the bathroom, expand the closet opening, and be intentional with the material selection to make the space feel larger.

THE SOLUTION

Our main solution in the kitchen space was to remove the wall. To keep the flow of the kitchen, we kept a small portion of the wall that the stairs ran into. This allowed space for the fridge to stay on the same wall. In the primary bathroom, our main solution to the awkward stairs was to rework where the closet door was. The solution we found was to move it from the bathroom to the bedroom. We also extended the steps that lead to both spaces for a better flow visually

THE RESULTS

The homeowners now had all the boxes checked for their new kitchen. A custom island that makes a huge statement with its Steely Blue painted finish, custom inset cabinetry, two end posts under the quartz overhang to provide additional seating, and stunning quartz tops to provide plenty of space for prep work. Full overlay cabinets for the perimeter that reached the ceiling with double stack flat crown. We pulled the Steely Blue color from the island into the perimeter by adding a utility cabinet for their pantry storage.

In the primary, we relocated the closet door to the bedroom which made the bathroom its own space and not a walkway to another room. This allowed the primary bathroom to transform into a spa retreat with a soaking tub, a large walk-in shower, and a custom hickory wood vanity to add a little character back into the space. By utilizing white tile with a mix of black metal and hickory accents, we were able to create a spa-like space with a cozy feel. Overall, this space is the perfect spot to relax at the end of a long day.





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UTILITIES DISTRICT



Pacific Hollow Renovation

THE CHALLENGE

Several walls on the main floor of this home divided the kitchen, dining room and living room creating a dim and uninviting space. The main level flooring consisted of hardwood floors, carpet and tile which deprived the space of any flow from room to room.

THE VISION

The homeowners envisioned an open floor plan with a separate walk-in pantry which would create the perfect gathering space for friends and family.

THE SOLUTION

Removing two walls that divided the main floor into several smaller rooms opened up the entire space. The kitchen was moved into the existing dining room and a separate walk-in pantry was created where the kitchen previously was.

THE RESULTS

The homeowners now enjoy an expansive kitchen consisting of a large center island, mixed wood cabinets, quartz backsplash, gas range, coffee bar and a walk-in pantry. This family can now enjoy the home they once only dreamed of.

THE **CHALLENGE**

Remodeling a builder-grade home with a dark, closed off kitchen presented several challenges. We needed to reconfigure the existing layout to create a more open



and functional space while maintaining structural integrity. Ensuring a seamless integration between the kitchen and surrounding living areas was a must, and character and customization were desperately needed.

THE VISION

The homeowners wanted us to create a sense of California living in the Midwest. The vision was to create a seamless flow by expanding the kitchen to the rest of the home. By removing the dividing wall, the connectivity and functionality of the kitchen would allow the space to be tied into the rest of the home. Maintaining continuity in materials, finishes, and color schemes throughout the space would ensure a cohesive aesthetic that would unify the home and give it a more inviting atmosphere.

THE SOLUTION

Taking down the wall between the kitchen and living spaces offered a solution that enhanced both functionality and aesthetics. Adding a beautiful hickory island and extending the kitchen cabinetry into the dining area helped join the spaces together. The light paint and warm, wide-planked, barn wood flooring throughout brought unity and brightness to the entire first floor and gave the homeowners a sense of coastal living.

THE RESULTS

By eliminating the kitchen wall, unifying the flooring, and remodeling the kitchen and bathrooms, the transformed home gained a newfound sense of openness and fluidity. The homeowners were provided a fresh, open, and cohesive space that is airy and inviting. With simple elegance that is comfortable and coastal, our clients now have the ambiance of California living in the Midwest.

METROPOLITAN UTILITIES DISTRICT



THE CHALLENGE

When the homeowners came to us, they had rooms that weren't being utilized, outdated layouts, and a desire for a main floor that is more functional for their family's busy lifestyle. We knew off the bat there were going to be challenges that we would encounter. However, we were ready to get to the drawing board and make the homeowners vision come to life!

THE VISION

To make the homeowners' vision come to life we needed to update the kitchen, transform the formal dining room into a space that is more functional, rework the laundry room and pantry area, and find room for a designated drop zone. We also needed to refresh a few spaces including the fireplace, powder bathroom, dining room, office, and entryway. Making the vision come to life was a challenging but rewarding process.

THE SOLUTION

By closing off the unused formal dining room from the entryway, we transformed the space into a laundry and drop zone and added an extra entrance from the garage to create easy access to that space.

The office doorways were moved to create a space the client could close off if needed but the large custom metal doors allowed the light from the windows to still reach the rest of the home. We tied in the metal look of the office doors into the railings in the entryway and refaced the fireplace to carry the modern look.

THE RESULTS

The results of this main floor renovation made the home almost unrecognizable. The mix of painted black and white oak cabinets gave the space a modern touch. As a result of the main floor renovation the kitchen gained a whole new look including additional seating, prep space, and storage due to the full overlay cabinets that went to the ceiling with a single flat stack piece of crown. Right off the kitchen, the powder bathroom was transformed with a beautiful hickory floating vanity and a whole wall of stone as an accent behind the mirror. The fireplace received new cabinets, floating shelves flanking either side as well as new stone for the face. Reworking the laundry, drop zone and pantry gave the clients all the necessary storage and designated spaces. Brick was a unique touch we added into a few spaces - the floor in the laundry room and pantry, behind the bar off the kitchen and behind the bathroom vanity mirror. Another unique touch we knew we needed to add was the medal detailing on the office doors and stair railings.


The clients love the way each space is unique but flows together seamlessly. This home is now a perfect space for family gatherings and summer soirces.

THE CHALLENGE

To update this 2003 Country Club style Kitchen and Family Room to a more family-friendly, interactive design. The homeowner also wanted more light, with views to their outdoor living Space.



THE VISION

The homeowners desired opening up and bridging the interior and exterior spaces, providing a natural flow from the kitchen into the adjacent hearth room. They wanted to utilize more natural finishes and modern fixtures in the kitchen, updating the interior finishes of the space, implementing new furnishings and finishing off with the perfect window coverings.

THE SOLUTION

Working with the homeowners vision, Eric Bosco and Bobbi Jo Cheek offered suggestions for design revisions, updated finishes and functionalities to better suit the homeowner's busy lifestyle.

THE RESULTS

Eric and Bobbi Jo worked with the homeowner to incorporate more modern finishes, while embracing timeless style. Moving from bar height to a standard countertop height made a surprising difference in form and function and provided a more open, casual feel to the space.

Eric exchanged maple cabinetry, granite countertops and a natural backsplash for stained Knotty Alder lower and painted upper cabinets, Quartzite countertops and handcrafted backsplash. Bobbi Jo replaced the outdated faux wood blinds with Hunter Douglas motorized window shades. The new window covering design brings the outdoors in, while offering added convenience.

The result is a kitchen that offers elegance and sophistication, while providing a more family friendly interactive experience at the heart of the home. Bobbi Jo finished off the rest of the main level with custom roman shades, highlighting Schumacher Fabrics.



THE CHALLENGE

The homeowners recently purchased this 60-year-old home in Old Town Elkhorn, and it was begging for attention and modernized updates. The homeowners were drawn into this home; a sprawling ranch located on a large, tree-lotted area with plenty of space.

THE VISION

The homeowners desired a more open-concept and modernized space, taking this home from the 1960s to a more traditional style. They knew they wanted to transform their home into a more functional and comfortable home, and to accomplish this, they would have to open up the kitchen space and fireplace located in the middle of the home.

THE SOLUTION

There was no doubt – the blue painted paneling located throughout the main floor had to go. Dave doubled the space of the kitchen, added a larger island for entertaining and more seating and updated the old white cabinets. They updated old hanging lighting fixtures with recessed can lighting, opened up the wall of the fireplace on both sides, allowing traffic to move through more freely. In addition to the updated interior living space, a glass sliding door was added to bring you directly into the newly renovated outdoor living space.

THE RESULTS

The homeowners were able to transition their outdated home to modernized and comfortable, without losing the warmth and character that appealed to them when purchasing. They were able to create a more spacious and comfortable space that is great for lounging or entertaining. The homeowners can now lounge in their renovated sun porch that is enjoyable from spring to fall.





THE CHALLENGE

The homeowners purchased a newly built custom home on the edge of Elkhorn in 2022 and soon learned that the outdoor space was not ideal for their growing family. They dreamed of a space to enjoy the outdoors without all the annoying bugs and wind. .

THE VISION

Initially the design focused on enclosing the space with screens. During the consultation, the owners realized their space was too small and they needed more living area open to the outside. They also wanted to include some luxurious amenities. To accomplish this, the existing covered patio would need to be extended and the roof redesigned.

THE SOLUTION


The existing roof over the patio was removed and new roof trusses were installed to span the large distance. The new roof extends into the yard to nearly double their covered space. New walls were built to house a gas fireplace with a stone façade. A half wall with a bar counter top creates a barrier between the new space and the outdoors. Motorized screens were installed on all three sides to allow for maximum enjoyment of the space regardless of outside conditions. The patio was extended further to the side for grilling and additional seating.

THE RESULTS

The homeowners now have options with an outdoor living room that can be secluded and private or open to the outdoors. When their young children get restless from being inside, they can enjoy the outdoors without the worry of insects or excessive weather conditions. The family can now enjoy all year long!

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
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A Rustic Retreat in Linden

THE CHALLENGE

This residential home had an adequate backyard space that was outdated and becoming less than functional for hosting. With an existing deck space that was deteriorating, a new gathering space was a must. Overgrown plant material obstructed views and enclosed the space further. In addition, large patches of dirt along the fenceline proved to be an eyesore.

THE VISION

Create a new backyard gathering space that provides multiple areas with different functions, while also integrating new landscape beds and plant materials to enhance new beauty and desired privacy.

THE SOLUTION

Create an entirely new concept suitable for large gatherings and manageable landscape elements. Removing unwanted and outdated existing structures allowed us to lay the groundwork for a fresh start. We envisioned and created an elevated patio design that maximized space while offering different viewpoints, adding a dynamic dimension to their backyard experience. By defining the patio into distinct functional areas, we were able to tailor choice of material and elements to suit specific purposes, creating practicality and aesthetic coherence. The large focal point of the space being a covered seating area that provided a cozy experience for users that can be utilized during inclement weather. Dedicating another portion of the patio to a grilling and dining section allows for easy hosting abilities and entertainment opportunities. To soften the new hardscape elements of this backyard, we integrated numerous landscape beds around and within the patio. To address the fenceline aesthetic problems, we extended an existing landscape bed and brought in new plant material to match landscape beds that are patio-side. This thoughtful decision contributed to a sense of unity throughout the whole backyard.

THE RESULTS

A new beautiful outdoor gathering space that meets their hosting needs and serves as an extension of their home's interior. Fostering a new love for the exterior of their home and inviting users to enjoy more time outside.

THE CHALLENGE

The Ridgefield Transitional Twist Remodel was a space that had great bones but lacked the soul that this young family was looking for in their space. While it had a large kitchen that was



added on years prior, it was outdated, had a low functioning wingback island, and minimal amenities. The remaining main floor had several personalities that the homeowners wanted to meld to create a space that was durable, functional, and had a lot more style.

THE VISION

Create a home that gave a nod to the transitional architectural style of the space but also infused the family's eclectic style and unique art. $\ .$

THE SOLUTION

Work WITH the space and not against it. Knowing that projects of this scale can add up very quickly, it was important to not delete every element of the space and have to spend a lot of money to add the character back in. Instead, they focused the funds into the elements that had the most bang for their buck: Flooring, kitchen island, bathroom, and new furniture. Then, we let the power of paint work its magic on the remaining elements and create a color scheme throughout the home that was "color without being colorful" and felt relaxed and casual. Mike James Renovation was able to get creative with transitioning the original to new elements and making sure everything flowed together seamlessly. The original wainscoting, coffered ceilings, perimeter kitchen cabinets and laundry room storage received their glow up through paintsaving the homeowners a large portion of their budget that could be allocated throughout the space.

THE RESULTS

A beautiful space that feels like a gut renovation, but salvaged a lot more than you'd expect. There are timeless elements like wainscoting, crown molding, and coffered ceilings mixed with warm updates like walnut-look flooring, saturated color, and modern artwork. THE CHALLENGE

Remodeling a U-shaped galley kitchen with multiple entry points presented a unique set of challenges that required careful planning and execution. Our primary challenge was how to maximize the existing space while eliminating bottlenecks, especially with multiple entries disrupting the kitchen's layout. Without compromising the usability of the space, balancing functionality and aesthetic was our highest priority. We strategically integrated essential appliances and storage solutions throughout the kitchen to distribute high-usage areas, allowing the entire space to be used more efficiently.

THE VISION

The vision for the design was to utilize mid-century straight lines and special feature elements to offer timeless sophistication and understated elegance. We wanted straight lines prominently featured throughout the space, offering a sense of order and simplicity. In order to infuse the space with character and charm, we included special feature elements such as LED lighting, iconic furniture pieces, and natural walnut which added personality and depth to the design.





THE SOLUTION

Light-colored material selections were used to draw the eye upward and create a sense of airiness. To add contrast, we used natural walnut to ground the space and channel the home's existing mid-century aesthetic. Appliances were reconfigured to maximize the flow. We added wraparound floating shelves with a vertical LED light feature to break up the wall of cabinetry and create visual interest.

THE RESULTS

Creating a space that feels both nostalgic and refreshingly contemporary, the result is a meticulously curated interior that pays homage to the iconic design principles of the mid-century era while incorporating modern comforts and amenities. We were able to honor the homeowners' desire to preserve the U-shaped galley kitchen while increasing functionality and efficiency. The thoughtful blend of past and present elements ensures that the space not only honors its design roots but also offers a welcoming and stylish kitchen for our homeowners.









THE CHALLENGE

This original, split-entry home in Rockbrook had many classic finishes of homes in the area. The kitchen was tight, space was unforgiving, and the overall flow could be improved and maximized. The fireplace was inefficient, open wood burning, completely impractical for families with small children. The existing



hydronic baseboard heating had to be removed to accommodate the updated kitchen cabinetry, and there were numerous existing windows to plan around in the kitchen.

THE VISION

Bright, open, airy, and modern was the goal. Just picture it: a totally reimagined, open, expansive and updated kitchen with an impressive addition of an appliance garage, a newly-established dining nook, beautiful open living room, a defined office space, and a new, stately entryway for a dramatic entrance to this amazingly refreshed Rockbrook home.

THE SOLUTION

The home was enhanced and refreshed through design and construction, with no element of this main floor left unturned. The back wall of the original kitchen was removed to create an open concept floor plan that expands the footprint of the home. Hydronic baseboard heaters with fans were planned where the baseboard heaters were removed. Additional kitchen storage was created, and a new dining room nook was established to better utilize the space of the home to meet the homeowner's needs.

THE RESULTS

The moment you open the front door, the entryway makes a statement, which leads to a stunning, totally renovated home with updated hardwoods throughout, modernized appliances and finishes in the kitchen to make a wow factor as the heart of the home. The now open concept space transcends homeowners and guests to an updated, cozy, and inviting retreat, perfect for hosting intimate or larger gatherings. Ample kitchen storage, a large island, and beautiful lighting throughout top off the look. The new dining nook is perfect for family meals, homework sessions, or game night. Inner Rail Food Hall serves as an outstanding community space for the Omaha Metro, but needed an addition that would create a high functioning space & allow end-users to enjoy the outdoor seating for a longer period of time throughout the year.

Create a solution that fits the narrow space, is safe for public use, and compliments the already stunning architectural features that the Food Hall and surrounding Aksarben areas offer.

THE SOLUTION

A seven-zone multilayered aluminum pergola with motorized louvers, heaters, lights, an integrated gutter system, and side panels that help diffuse the once "wind-tunnel" in the Food Hall. Factoring in both the aesthetics and what the public would appreciate are the most important aspects of a project like this. Between both the heaters & pergola, this outdoor space will extend its use by approximately 30-45 days per year.

THE RESULTS

A space that will bring the Omaha Metro together outdoors for a longer period of time throughout the year. With all of the creativity in the Aksarben area, there needed to be a pergola structure that would fit in seamlessly with the other architectural elements that the Aksarben area has to offer.

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
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


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
